HeartGroups Testimonies

I received this recently from a host of one of our new HeartGroups. I was so touched by seeing that this style of gathering is happening, I thought I would share it along with this ministry update:

"After our supper Friday evening we gathered in the living room for our meeting. One of our sisters was absent due to not feeling well. We commented how much we missed her and her husband, and someone spontaneously prayed for her and her husband as her caregiver. As we started to share our week together, someone asked another member how she was doing. She has also been struggling with health issues. She shared how she has been very depressed of late and doesn't seem to really care if she gets better or not. We immediately stopped the conversation and once again had prayer together over her, asking God to restore to her the joy of living. A request was made to sing 1 John 4:7-8 "Beloved, let us love one another." After the song another member excitedly shared how just the evening before he had been studying that very verse and he then proceeded to share for about 20 minutes what that verse has meant to him.

Several more songs followed, with individuals sharing why those songs held special meaning for them. Another individual shared a heartache he was carrying and once again we stopped for spontaneous prayer. Then this same individual read a story he had brought to share with the group, that God had impressed

him with during the week. Believe it or not, it fit perfectly in with the theme of 1 John 4. After he read the story we burst into song again. There was a lot more sharing in and around all this.

While we did not have an agenda for the evening, I believe God definitely did, because He seemed to be impressing everyone with the same message. I guess this is what happens when you allow your worship to be God led instead of man led. We just have to learn to be tuned in."

withhold forgiveness until we apologize? Which comes first, repentance and confession or forgiveness? Does a loving God require us to ask Him before He'll forgive? How can God require us to forgive those who have wronged us, even those who have never asked to be forgiven, if He Himself doesn't even give blanket forgiveness to everyone, too? What does forgiveness even mean? When we place the transparency of the life of Jesus over these questions, a new dimension to our understanding begins to emerge. Did Jesus really mean, "If you've seen me, you've seen the Father" and what does this mean when we apply it to what we believe about God's forgiveness? If you have ever wrestled with truly feeling that you are forgiven, this series is for you. If you have ever wrestled with truly forgiving others who have hurt you, this series is for you too. Have your heart set free, as you encounter God and experience His radical, self-sacrificial, other-centered forgiveness as you never have before. Experience the difference it makes when we embrace the truth that Jesus is the exact "Image" of what God is like, especially in relation to divine forgiveness (Hebrews 1:1-3; John 1:18; Matthew 5:44,45).

The Pastor of this church has also had to make some pretty difficult calls on the direction of this church over the past few years, decisions that were the result of a deep desire to follow Jesus. And just as anyone knows who is following Jesus, the reason the followers of Jesus hope in the resurrection is because following Jesus always results in putting them on a cross. Although I encouraged these groups to begin moving away from what some call a "Honey, I shrunk the church" style (where those present are still simply passive spectators) to a more open, mutually participatory style mirrored in the New Testament ekklesia, I was also simply thankful to see such openness to God's radical love and his other worldly Kingdom in Edmonds. I love what I see happening here! Certainly Jesus Christ is alive enough to still lead those who used to belong to God's enemy. Long live the beautiful revolution! Christ's kingdom come. May God's eternal desire (Genesis 1:26; John 17) for us be restored among us once again, just as it is, in heaven (Matthew 5:10).

New North American Sharing Book for 2014

Lastly, this past month, I finished the final edits for the North American Division Sharing Book for 2014, entitled Missing Dad, published by the Review and Herald. It will be on bookshelves in the fall of 2013. The first half of this volume is a condensed version of the chapters found in my book Finding the Father that so many have found helpful concerning our misconceptions of God and the role He plays in human suffering. The second half of this volume is dedicated to the Cross and Victory of Christ, and what the Cross, as seen through the perspective of Jesus, tell us about who and what God really is and what He deeply feels for each one of us. I am so excited to be offering this content in this format in an effort to allow Jesus once again to challenge not simply our culture's misperceptions of what God is like, but even some of our religion's (Christianity's) most cherished, but nonetheless incorrect, pictures of God, as well. Jesus said it best: "If you've seen me, you've seen the Father" (John 14:9). We'll keep you posted with more updates as the publishing date gets closer.
